- **LATE Registration: (Rec'd after January 23, 2016) – A \$25 Non Refundable LATE FEE will be added. All late registrations will be reviewed and accepted based on roster openings.**

ONLINE REGISTRATION

Rather than using the paper registration form please consider using our on-line registration available at <https://lysa.demosphere-secure.com/registration>

It is fast, easy, safe and secure. It would be a significant help to our volunteer organization. With online registration you can register, and either pays with a credit card or mail in a check or money order, along with the required paperwork. See Page 6 for required paperwork.

WALK-IN REGISTRATION

Walk-In Registration will be held on **January 13th 2016. Watch for email notification and/or advertisement in the Le Roy Penny Saver.**

At walk-in registration time you may (1) register, (2) turn in any information needed to complete your online registration, i.e., picture, birth certificate, payment, (3) sign up for a volunteer duty or (4) ask questions. If you registered online and would like to pay and/or drop off your additional documentation, you do not need to complete a hard copy of the registration form. Just bring the filing receipt you received via email upon completion of your online registration with you along with your the additional documents, etc.

MAIL-IN REGISTRATION

Registration forms are provided on our website to be printed off and mailed in with check or money order. They will also be available at our walk-in-registration date.

PLAYER INFORMATION: The Player should be registered based on the Player's date-of-birth, Player's grade – please use the grade the Player is entering into in the **Fall of 2016** (i.e., if Player is in 1st grade now, you would enter 2nd grade for the Fall of 2016.)

NOTE: LYSA signs Players up based on their birth dates. That is where they would be placed on a team first. From there we look at grade level moves, the league they are registering to play in (recreational or competitive) and/or where they played at the school level, etc. Specific requests for a Player to “play up” for whatever reason or for a specific coach or for their child to be put on a team with another child are reviewed; however, we do not usually grant specific requests because if we grant one, we have to grant them all. We do not guarantee that any grade level move can be made. Each year is different and we simply do not know what will happen until the given year.

REGISTRATION FEE: See Chart below on Page 8 & 9.

VOLUNTEER FEE: In addition to the registration fee there will be a \$25 volunteer fee charged per family. This fee is refundable* ONLY AFTER a volunteer duty has been **completed.** (NOTE: The \$25 fee will show up as a service fee on your online registration receipt). You can sign up for a task (1) during the online registration process, (2) in person during our walk-in registration or (3) contact lysavol14482@gmail.com and a volunteer coordinator will get back to you. **NOTE: Due to the lack of volunteers willing to help this cost is likely to increase to \$50 per family in 2017.**

MULTI-PLAYER DISCOUNT: LYSA offers a multiplayer discount to families who sign up more than 2 players from the same household, i.e. pay for the two oldest players and the rest are free. **Unfortunately, the online registration process cannot accommodate the discount. For our records, please pay the full amount and a refund* will be issued as soon as possible after payment is received.**

PAYMENT: You can pay by cash, check, money order or credit card*. If you are using our online registration and paying by check, make checks payable to “LYSA” and send payment and all necessary forms to: LYSA, P.O. Box 144, Le Roy, NY 14482. Or, payment and registration forms/documents can be brought into walk-in registration to complete the registration process.

Full payment is due by February 27th. 1st Payments (or initial signup) received after January 23, 2016 (postmarked by) will be considered late and the late fee of \$25 will be assessed.

***REFUNDS: When payment is made by credit card, refunds (volunteer refunds or otherwise) will be refunded directly back to the card used at the time of payment. All other refunds will be issued by LYSA via check to the person/address listed on the registration form unless otherwise advised.**

There will be NO REFUNDS AFTER UNIFORMS HAVE BEEN ORDERED (except for volunteer fee refunds). At that point in time teams have been formed, games have been scheduled, fields have been committed too, referees have been assigned etc. This is usually early March.

ADDITIONAL DOCUMENTATION NEEDED FOR REGISTRATION:

- BIRTH CERTIFICATE: NEW Players (all ages) or Players that DID NOT play in the RDYSL league for LYSA in prior year will need to provide a COPY of a birth certificate to show proof of age at the time of registration.
- PHOTO: TRAVEL LEAGUE PLAYERS ONLY (U11 and up) will need to provide a photo for their travel pass issued.

The photo needs to be cut to size: 1 inch by 1 inch OR 1.5 inch x 1.5 inch (see template below). Photos need to be **current, clear, in color, above the shoulder, front head shot of the player.** We will not be cutting pictures or resizing them for you. If the photo does not meet the specifications required, the registration will be **incomplete. NO EXCEPTIONS.** Please use the template below if you are unsure of the size.

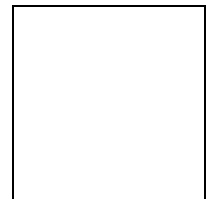

LEAGUES AND AGE DIVISIONS:

U6 & U8: (“House” League - Recreational):

- Approx. 9 -10 weeks. **TENTATIVE start date: April 30, 2016**
- Teams are Coed. NO travel involved. Held at Church Fields on Saturday mornings. Hartwood and Bunnell Park is offline due to construction for the summer of 2016

- **U6 (GPS First Touch Program)** - Saturdays – 9 a.m. to 10 a.m. U6 is about skill development and maximizing touches. **First Touch Program** will be expanded to include possible small-sided games. *Details to be worked out with GPS*
- **U8 (GPS Kick Start Program)** - Saturdays – 10 a.m. to 11 a.m. U8 continues with skill development. **GPS Kick Start Program** will also be expanded to include small-sided games for more touches with the ball. *Details to be worked out with GPS.*

U10: (“U10 League” – Recreational Travel):

- Approx. 13-15 weeks. **TENTATIVE start date: Week of May 1st, 2016**
- Teams: Girls and Boys, NO coed.
- Practice Schedule: **Boys and Girls: TBD: Typical times are** - 6:30 to 7:30/8:00 p.m. during the weekdays. There will be also a session held on Saturday morning (**GPS Rising Star Program**) for all U10 boys/girls from 11 a.m. to Noon **starting May 7th** with the GPS coach focusing on player development. There is no additional cost it is included in the registration. It is not optional. This is part of LYSA’s U10 program.
- Game nights - to be determined.
- Local travel required, within 20-30 minutes. The TENTATIVE plan is 10 to 12 games, with 5 to 6 games being away.
- Included in the registration fee is one tournament, the Chili Soccer Association Hot Dog Cup, to be held on **June 25 and 26, 2016 (TENTATIVE DATES)**. **If your child is not able to make the tournament, please advise your coach ASAP.**
- End of Season tournament held at Batavia Sports Park – End of July – Date TBD.

U11 thru U19:

We are currently working with GPS to provide a pre-season clinic to be held in May before games begin for ALL.

RDYSL: Player pass required

- TENTATIVE start date: Late April, weather dependent
- **“NEW League Rules for division”** U11/U12: 16 players per team/per game maximum was 18 in 2015 (8 vs. 8 for 2016 was 9 vs. 9 for 2015)
- U13 thru U19: 22 player maximum roster/team size. Only 18 players per game can play, 4 will sit out.
- RDYSL away games are typically played in Monroe County and its surrounding counties. Teams may travel to Hilton, Fairport, Canandaigua, Churchville, Gates, Brockport, Livonia, Webster, Henrietta, Bloomfield Albion, and York, to name a few.

NOTE: RDYSL teams are filled on a first-come-first-serve basis, as there is a minimum/maximum team size, SO REGISTER EARLY. The registration forms will be dated as they are postmarked and/or received and teams will be created as the paperwork and monies are received. **Registration is not deemed complete until ALL necessary documentation is received (as stated above).**

NOTE: There is no equal playing time rule for RDYSL. The coach determines playing time based on the players’ level of commitment to the game/team, their respect for the team/coach, etc. **RECREATIONAL TRAVEL** has no maximums for team size and teams are split as equally as possible using a draft. Players are played as equally as possible for the game. **(This is where you and your child need to decide ability, commitment and level of play.)**

NOTE: Secondary Player Notification: Any player playing in other leagues or on other teams **MUST** identify themselves as secondary players on the registration form. A Player can play on 1 team per league (this means that you can only play on 1 team in RDYSL and 1 team in another league). **This will be handled on a first come, first serve basis.**

NOTE: WE WILL NEED COACHES. LYSA strongly encourages coaches to take the Youth module coaches' (F for 2016) course or the minimum "E" coaching course.

ALL coaches must pass a background check that is provided to us through NYSWYSA. For information about the courses, please contact LYSA or NYSWYSA.

TEAMS ARE DETERMINED BY LYSA. NOT A COACH, PARENT OR SPONSOR.

AGE MATRIXES & COST

Instructions:

- (1) Find the month the player was born in the top row; (2) Move down the column until you reach the year the player was born; (3) Trace that row to the left until you reach the first column. The entry will contain the player's Age Group; (4) If a player's month and year of birth is not found in the age matrix then the player is not eligible to be on a team for LYSA. The U6 age group means players under the age of 6 years old, to include 5 year olds. The U8 age group will include 7 and 8 year olds. ***(Exception for 5 year olds; we extend the calendar to include those that would be entering Kindergarten using the school calendar 11/30 instead of 7/31 as an end date)**

PARTICIPATION

LYSA is a not-for-profit organization made up entirely of volunteer Board members. In fact, everyone involved with LYSA are volunteers; coaches and the like. Without the support and time commitment from the volunteers and community, LYSA would not exist

FEEDBACK

LYSA's program is to provide a fun and rewarding experience for your child. We encourage your positive suggestions. The Board is committed to continually improving Le Roy Youth Soccer.

In order to ensure that your questions, concerns, comments or suggestions are addressed by the people that are directly involved; we ask that you follow the following line of communication:

If you have a question, concern, comment or suggestion regarding the Le Roy Youth Soccer program, please feel free to speak with any member of the Board or email us at leroyyouthsoccer@hotmail.com.

If you have a question, concern, comment or suggestion regarding a specific team, please speak directly to the Coach of that team first. Please speak with the Coach before or after practices and not on game day or after a specific game. If you have an issue with the way the Coach has handled a situation please allow a 24 hour cool off time before confronting the Coach directly.

If your child is having an issue on the team, please address this directly with the Coach first. If you feel that the Coach was unable to help you, you should then contact a board member. Please be considerate of the time that you call.

If, at any point, your question, concern, comment or suggestion has not been addressed to your satisfaction, you should feel free to bring the matter before the Board at a meeting.

BEHAVIOR

LYSA's mission is to provide the youth of the Le Roy, New York area the opportunity to participate in recreational and competitive soccer leagues by teaching and demonstrating soccer skills, sportsmanship, honesty, respect and fair play. We will strive to provide a safe environment where our youth not only can excel in their soccer skills, but also to learn the importance of physical fitness in their lives. We will provide an atmosphere where the players' emotional well-being will be nurtured as they learn the importance of teamwork, determination, persistence and hard work. All members will work towards instilling in our youth the enjoyment and fun aspects of the game of soccer. We will expect good citizenship and proper regard for the rights of others.

LYSA's CODE OF CONDUCT:

LYSA exists to provide youth with opportunities to participate in organized competition and improve their soccer skills. Team members are expected to maintain high standards of sportsmanship towards teammates, coaches, opponents and officials. Participants represent their community, families, and team in every contest.

Any parents/guardians/families of players that are in attendance at any LYSA event, whether home or away, are expected to exhibit the same high standards of sportsmanship while observing at practices and/or games.

LYSA encourages good sportsmanship by POSITIVE support for ALL players, coaches and officials at all times.

LYSA encourages placing the emotional and physical well being of the child ahead of any personal desire to win.

LYSA encourages children playing in a safe and healthy environment, and demands a drug, alcohol and tobacco-free sports environment for the children.

LYSA encourages parents' support for coaches and officials working with the players to provide a positive, enjoyable experience for all.

LYSA encourages all players to treat coaches, fans, opposing teams and officials with respect regardless of race, sex, creed or ability.

Failure of either party to abide by these standards may result in disciplinary action including, but not limited to, expulsion from further participation without refund of fees.

By registering and signing the registration form, you are stating that you have read the above statements and agree that you and your family will abide by the standards of good sportsmanship throughout the season, and any disciplinary ruling that may be necessary.

PARENT/GUARDIAN BEHAVIOR

You will find it easy to get caught up in the excitement of the game. However, we ask that you remember that this is **YOUTH** soccer. **Regardless of the level, please keep your comments positive and encouraging to everyone, including the opposing team. We ask that you set a positive example for the children.**

The coaching staff has a very difficult job. They are volunteers. Many of the coaches are learning right along with the kids. Not all calls by the coach or the referee will be to your satisfaction. **Please keep the negative comments to yourself. The coaching staff works very hard for your child, and they need as much encouragement from you as possible. Please allow the coaches to coach your child during games.**

24 Hour delay for calling the coach: If you as a parent have an issue with a coach's decision about your child during a game, we ask you to delay your immediate response to contact the coach and speak your mind. Please refrain from contacting the coach for 24 hours.

BEHAVIOR POLICY

Sideline behavior continues to be an issue at **ALL** levels of play. As a result, the **ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY** implemented by New York State West Soccer Association in 2009 (in which LYSA is a member) is active for all age levels.

Please take a few minutes to read through the Zero Tolerance Policy adopted by New York State West to gain an understanding. Go to: [www. http://www.nyswysa.org/](http://www.nyswysa.org/). By registering your child to participate in the program you are agreeing to the zero tolerance policy.

TOBACCO AND ALCOHOL USE

- The use of tobacco/alcohol is **prohibited** at any function on the Le Roy Central School grounds. New York State mandates that the school be tobacco free.
- There is also **NO SMOKING** at Bunnell/Hartwood Park, Emery Park or at the Church Fields on the West Bergen Rd. Please be aware and considerate of others at all venues.

PLAYER PARTICIPANT BEHAVIOR

- Drinking of alcoholic beverages, tobacco use, or use of drugs is strictly forbidden. Violators will be immediately suspended from the program pending review of the Board of Directors.
- Use of foul language will not be tolerated.
- Misconduct at practice or during a game will not be tolerated.
- Misconduct in the parking lot before or after practices and games will not be tolerated.
- Bullying will not be tolerated.
- Self control and respect for all coaches, officials, teammates, and spectators is expected.
- Unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated.
- Respect for the opposing team and/or coach is expected. Shaking the hands of the opposing team and coach is expected in a respectful and congratulatory manner.
- Respect the judgment of the officials. Do not argue with their call.
- Behavior while in uniform reflects on everyone, the team, the coach, the community.
- Understand and abide by the rules.
- Accept winning and/or losing with dignity.

PRACTICE

General

- Practices will be held at the following locations: **NEW due to construction at School**
 - * INSTRUCTIONAL/BEGINNERS (U6 & U8) – Church Fields until further notice
 - * INTERMEDIATE (U10) – Calvary Baptist Church Fields until further notice
 - * TRAVEL TEAMS (U11-U12) - Calvary Baptist Church fields or Emery Park
 - * TRAVEL TEAMS (U13-U19) – Hartwood Park or Emery Park

NOTE: Game days for the travel leagues; is dependent on the League's schedule of games and/or coach's availability for the given year. LYSA suggests to the coaches to practice on game days for consistency. There may be practices and/or games on Friday, Saturday or Sundays.

What to Bring

- Each week players must bring their own ball (see below for sizes).

U6 & U8	-	Size 3
U10 & U12	-	Size 4
U13 & up	-	Size 5
- Cleats are optional for U6 & U8; however, they do provide better traction. They are MANDATORY for all other age groups (must be soccer cleats, no metal cleats or other sports cleat allowed).
- Shin guards are MANDATORY for all ages, and socks must be worn OVER the shin guards.
- Each player should bring ample water to practices and games.
- Each player should dress appropriately for the weather conditions. Be prepared.

Weather

- Plan to practice and/or play a game rain or shine. If the weather conditions are questionable, the coach will determine if practice will be cancelled. If it begins to thunder and/or lightning, practices (and games) will be stopped immediately and brought to a safe location. After a 30-minute delay with no thunder and/or lightning, practice and/or a game will resume. The Referee decides if the game will be cancelled at game time.
- You are responsible for picking up your child following such cancellations. If the weather conditions are questionable at the start of a game or a practice, we recommend that you stay instead of dropping off your child.

Absences and Tardiness

While LYSA does not have a written policy on this topic, it is expected that respect and courtesy be given to the coach and fellow teammates. Each player is a part of the "TEAM". You cannot come together as a TEAM if you are not at practices. It will be left to the discretion of the individual coach, but if your child is continually late or absent from practice, they may not be able to participate in games. In the event the player cannot make a scheduled practice or game, **please contact the coach ASAP.** We realize this is summer time; however, by signing up to play you have made a commitment to the coach and team.

Injury

Please report all injuries to the player's coach, whether it occurred during a practice, game or at home no matter how minor the injury may be for safety reasons.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Coaches will begin to contact their team mid to late April to introduce them and discuss team information.

UNIFORMS and other valuable information will be handed out at a practice or when available.

FUNDRAISERS: There will be fundraisers. Information will be handed out by the coach or team parent as it becomes available.

FALL SKILLS DEVELOPMENT: LYSA has been offering this program since the fall of 2008 and is dependent upon availability of volunteer coaching staff. It typically starts the first week in September and lasts until Mid October, weather pending. The cost is kept to minimum. It focuses on skills development for grades K through 6. There are no uniforms or scheduled games. Registration will be in August. Watch for details in the Le Roy Penny Saver, on LYSA's website or email blasts.

WINTER INDOOR TRAINING: This training is dependent upon school availability. Training held at the Le Roy High School Gymnasium on Sundays, beginning in January, in the time range of 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., depending on the age and gym availability. The sessions are for 10 weeks. Boys and Girls ages 5 thru 9 sessions focus on ball mastery and agility. Boys and Girls ages 10 thru 14 focus on skills and fitness. Registration would begin in November. Watch for details in Le Roy Penny Savor, on LYSA's website or email blasts.

FINES

The person responsible for the incident will be the person responsible for the fines. Players WILL NOT be eligible to play until all fines are paid in full and terms of the suspension has been fulfilled. If you are fined as a spectator, your child will not be eligible to play until the fine is paid in full.

U6 thru U8 Fines: We do not have specific fines for this age group; generally it is not a problem. If it becomes necessary, we will handle the situation based upon the fines outlined below. LYSA will address each case individually for this age group.

Suspensions mean:

- **As a spectator you MAY NOT be in attendance to ANY team League events until the suspension has been served. You cannot be on the sidelines or in the parking lot; you are not permitted to watch any game until the suspension has been fulfilled and the fine paid in full. Suspension will pertain to the age group/team that you where fined at. You may drop your child off and pick them up.**
- **As a player you must serve the suspension by attending the scheduled games by sitting on the bench, you cannot be dressed to play or participate in warm-ups. You are there to support your team in a positive manner. Coaches are responsible to see that the player does not play and is in attendance until the suspension has been satisfied and the fine paid in full.**
- **Payment: make check payable to LYSA for the full amount and hand in personally to a Board Member**
